There's No Place Like Home... **Enjoying the Familiar and Embracing the New**

Dear Friends,

As I write to you, I am sitting in the dining room of our house. Theresa and I are home! After fourteen months in temporary housing, packing, unpacking, repacking, and numerous meetings with the insurance company and contractors, our house has been rebuilt (after having been crushed by a large and heavy oak tree) and we have returned to it. It is wonderful to be back in our own confines. So much is familiar and comforting, and yet, it is not quite the same. The walls and ceilings and floors and windows are similar, but not exactly as they were before. The colors are a bit different. The furniture is sort of like our furniture, but not quite. The kitchen is in the same place as before, but the layout is different (still having trouble remembering where we put everything). And yet, it is home, even with the changes.

Many of you have been physically separated from Holy Trinity Church due to the COVID-19 pandemic. You have been with us on Sunday mornings online or Saturday nights by phone, but that is different from being in physical community with each other. We are incarnational people who need to see, hear and be present together in community. Perhaps now is the time to physically return to Holy Trinity. You will find much that is the same - the liturgy, the hymns, the

Sacraments, the building itself, and the familiar faces in the choir and at the altar. But as I discovered when moving home, some things may not be exactly the same. Communion and the offering are received differently. Part of the nave is marked out for social distancing. Because of livestreaming, movement on the altar is a bit more restricted, and there are far fewer in-person meetings and classes. But God is still with us at Holy Trinity Church, and it is still our spiritual home.

With vaccinations, safety protocols, and low transmission rates in our area, it is safer to gather in person than it has been for months. (Of course, this can change depending on the virus.) For now, I invite you to come home to Holy Trinity Church on Sunday, September 19 for Celebration Sunday and a special coffee hour. If you are able, come and experience again the familiar and embrace that which is different. Above all, remember, it's all about Jesus, who is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

Hope to see you in church this fall season.

Special Parish Meeting Beginning the Episcopal Election Process...

You may be aware that Bishop Stokes has announced his plan to retire in June of 2023 and he has called for the election of the 13th Bishop of the Diocese of New Jersey. The process for electing a new bishop begins with parish meetings to elect six delegates who will attend a special Camden Convocation meeting on October 24 to elect one clergy member and one lay person to serve on the Episcopal Nominating and Election Committee. We will meet after the 9:15 service on September 26th at coffee hour for the sole purpose of electing our six delegates. We ask that everyone make an effort to attend this meeting, which will be brief. If you are interested in being nominated as a delegate, please let Fr. Chattin know ASAP.
